\$60,000 RAISED FOR HURRICANE KATRINA VICTIMS

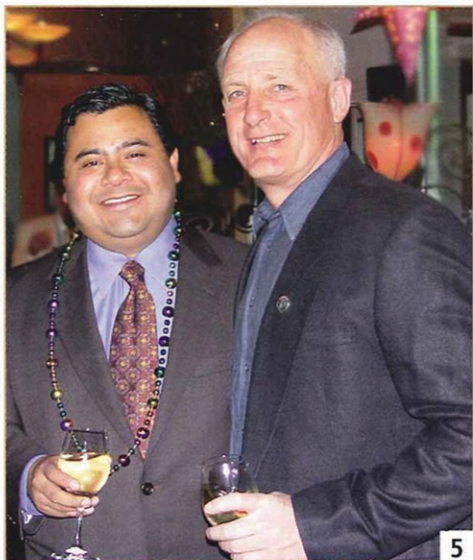
More than 150 people attended the 1.2.1 Foundation's first annual fundraiser at Viva in Los Gatos. Known as "Bring Home the Bayou," the event raised \$60,000 for the Marianites of the Holy Cross, an order of nuns who have served New Orleans since 1858. Since Hurricane Katrina, the sisters have distributed small grants to displaced residents of the Lower Ninth Ward in New Orleans who lost their homes, were left without jobs, or have suffered from other hurricane-related issues. The fundraiser will double the sisters' budget over the next year.
